This table estimates Apportionments for FY 2004-2009 based on factors used for FY 2005.

Changes in OHV registrations and use will affect annual apportionments.

The FY 2004 Apportionments had a 0.59% reduction, and FY 2005 had a 0.80% reduction. This table assumes no reductions (not even FY 2004 or FY 2005).

Puerto Rico is not eligible for RTP funds under the House or Senate proposals. It did not comply with eligibility requirements when eligible prior to TEA-21.
